Key Things to Know:

There are no chugim on holidays, minimum days, or during Parent/Teacher Conferences. Class days are listed per class. No refunds will be given after the first class, unless the course is canceled. If a particular class does not meet the minimum number of students it will be canceled and you will be notified. Time spent in Gesher before chugim is provided free as a service to our families. Time spent in Gesher after chugim is billed at the standard drop in rate, unless your child is contracted to be in Gesher that day.

Keep in mind:

If your child is already contracted for Gesher, you may only alter your contract once per year. There are no in/out privileges once a monthly rate is established. The monthly rate for Gesher care, which includes time for conferences, may still be beneficial for your family. Please make sure to examine your family schedules and estimated pick up times. If you are billed at the Drop-In Gesher rate, you will be billed at the non-contract rate for the time spent in Gesher **after** the chug is finished for the day.

Pickup:

You may use the token given to you to enter the gate and pick up your student(s) from Gesher or a chug/afterschool activity. You will be able to find TK-5 students at the end of an activity at the blue picnic tables. If after the majority of the students attending are picked up, remaining students will be cared for in Gesher. You may then pick them up either on the play structure or in the tent on the Shalom Field adjacent to the building. Please be sure to sign out your student on the portal or they may be logged in for the full afternoon until 6pm.

Middle School students may be dismissed to depart campus after their activity. Please make sure to discuss a plan with them regarding pick up times and locations.

Mock Trial



What: In this class, students will learn about the United States system of justice by conducting a mock criminal trial. Students will learn how to make persuasive arguments, separating the key facts and evidence from the less persuasive details. Throughout the semester course, students will have the opportunity to portray the different roles present in a criminal trial: prosecutor, defense counsel, as well as witnesses for the prosecution and defense. They will make opening statements and closing arguments, and will learn how to make legal objections as they examine and cross-examine key witnesses. The class will examine the strengths and weaknesses of our criminal justice system, exploring the roles and responsibilities of judges and jurors, and how our society makes decisions about innocence, guilt and punishment. Taught by Sarah Blake, Neal Rubin, and Annie O'Donnell.

Neal Rubin, an alumni parent and board member, has been an Assistant US Attorney in San Francisco, representing the federal government in legal trials, and was later VP of Global Litigation for Cisco Systems. Sarah Blake was a Deputy District Attorney for more than 15 years prosecuting many different types of crime in San Mateo County. Annie O'Donnell, worked in civil litigation for 9 years, and wrote for a national legal publication for 4 years, prior to joining Wornick.
